About us

Stephens County Fire Services covers an area of 176 square miles (add landmarks). In addition, we have Mutual Aid agreements to assist fire departments in bordering counties in Georgia and South Carolina: Banks, Franklin, Habersham, Oconee, and the City of Toccoa.

Stephens County has an ISO rating of 6/10. An ISO 6 class applies to all structures located within 5 miles of a fire station and 1000 feet from a fire hydrant. An ISO class 10 applies to all structures greater than 5 miles of a fire station and over 1000 feet of a fire hydrant. Many homeowners throughout Stephens County benefit, thru lower insurance premiums, from this ISO classification 6.

Stephens County Fire Services consist of seven volunteer fire departments that proudly provide fire suppression, hazardous materials response, fire prevention training, and community education programs to the citizens and visitors of Stephens County. In addition, the Stephens County First Responder program is run through the Fire Service assisting Stephens County Emergency Medical Service.

VOLUNTEER!

Stephens County Fire Services is looking for quality volunteers. Each station has their own application process to become a volunteer. Please contact the fire department you want to volunteer with for their particular application.

After accepted by a local fire department you will be a Probationary Firefighter as long as you are a minimum of 18 years of age. At the discretion of the chief and completion of the Volunteer Firefighter with Live Fire course, you will be recognized as a Firefighter. The course targets those individuals who have the desire to become recognized and registered as a volunteer firefighter in the State of Georgia. The purpose is to meet the minimum training requirements as required by Georgia Law (O.C.G.A. Title 25) and Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is my fire insurance rating?

A: Stephens County has an ISO rating of 6/10. An ISO 6 class applies to all structures located within 5 miles of a fire station and 1000 feet from a fire hydrant. An ISO class 10 applies to all structures greater than 5 miles of a fire station and over 1000 feet of a fire hydrant.

Q: How do I get a copy of a fire report?

A: For fire reports, call your local fire department. Provide address, date and time if known of incident

Q: Why does the fire engine go out on medical calls?

A: To ensure quick response and adequate assistance on all emergency scenes.

Q: Does the Department repair hydrants or service hydrants for leaks?

A: No. Individuals can call the City of Toccoa Water Department.

Q: Does Stephens County allow outdoor burning?

A: Yes, but you need to obtain a burn permit from Georgia Forestry Commission at GaTrees.org or 1.877.OK2-BURN for hand piled vegetation burns. For larger machine piled burns you need to contact the local Georgia Forestry Office at 706-754-2354 . It is unlawful to burn man made materials such as tires, shingles, plastics, lumber, household garbage, etc. Permits are issued only for natural vegetative materials. State law requires residents to obtain a burn permit before burning outdoors. Illegal burning without a permit is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and a year imprisonment.
